## #109-10 ASSISTANT PROFESSOR (HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL PRESERVATION)

<b>Location:</b>	Sponsored Programs and Research/Richard F. Taitano Micronesia Area Research Center (MARC)
<b>University Information:</b>	The University of Guam is the premier institution of higher education in the Western Pacific. It is a land-grant institution, accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges Senior Commission. Located in the village of Mangilao on the island of Guam, the campus overlooks beautiful Pago Bay and the university's world-class Marine Biology Lab. The university has 3,500 students, 90% of Asian or Pacific Islander ancestry, providing a uniquely diverse campus and multicultural atmosphere. As a regional, comprehensive, open admissions institution, the university awards degrees at the baccalaureate and master's levels through its two colleges and three professional schools. Over the next five years, the university will be entering an exciting period of growth linked to anticipated increases in military investments and resultant economic expansion in Guam. Three major University initiatives have been developed to maximize academic and community opportunities during this period: "UOG, the Natural Choice" to encourage local students to aspire to attend college and to choose the University of Guam; "UOG Green" with renewable energy and sustainability central to the initiative; and "UOG Leading Change" on Guam and in Micronesia. Extramural funding from competitive Federal sources as well as contracts is rapidly expanding. Such opportunities along with a critical mass of dedicated and capable administration, faculty, students, and staff make the University of Guam an exciting place to be for many years to come.
<b>General Description:</b>	The University of Guam is looking for an individual who is interested in new challenges and opportunities for professional and personal growth. This position calls for someone who is adaptable, intelligent, possesses a global vision and who is interested in working in a dynamic, multi-cultural institution.
<b>Character of Duties:</b>	The position MARC Historian/Historical Preservation will support the increasing environmental and heritage compliance studies due to Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process and increasing construction efforts on Guam. This position requires knowledge and experience in Spanish documentary and historical landscapes to teach regional history as well as applications of documentary research skills to historical preservation efforts in Guam and the region. Historical preservation specialists are critically needed for federal and GovGuam agencies, non-profits, and public schools in anticipation of the Guam/military buildup. This will also support the other faculty teaching courses in the Micronesia Studies (graduate) and History (undergraduate) degree programs that have an average enrollment of 25 and 152 students, respectively. Furthermore, the position will be combined teaching /research and will require active field research projects to facilitate student learning/training.
<b>Qualifications:</b>	The position requires a Ph.D degree in History, 10 years experience in Pacific Islands research, and an active publication record in peer-reviewed journals.
<b>Salary Level:</b>	Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience relevant to the position. <i>(100% ARRA Funding through September 30, 2011 only and funded up to the amount authorized)</i> Assistant Professor \$38,316 - \$56,195
<b>Appointment/Relocation:</b>	This is a nine (9) month appointment.
<b>Benefits:</b>	Fringe benefits include subsidized hospitalization and medical plans, life insurance, cafeteria plan (flexible Tax benefit plan), and the Government of Guam retirement plan.

**Work Eligibility:**

Submission of completed job applications authorizes the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (e.g. previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records). All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job related sources from legal liability for the information provided.

Should an applicant be convicted of any crimes other than a minor traffic violation, all applicable information must be provided in the form of a police clearance report and court clearance report. Failure to admit any felony convictions may result in immediate disqualification or disciplinary action.


Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter. A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.

Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position with the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with this law.

If applicable, the applicant is subject to E-Verify Rules.
