MINIMUM EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

- A) One year of experience in planning, developing, coordinating or implementing of programs or projects or closely related work and graduation from a recognized college or university with a Bachelor's degree; or
- B) Any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the minimum knowledge, abilities, and skills.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: Pursuant to Public Law 26-87, all future employees of any position within the government of Guam will be required at minimum to possess one of the following:

1. High School Diploma; or
2. A successful completion of General Education Development (GED) Test; or
3. Any equivalent of high school program, or a successful completion of certification program, from a recognized accredited or certified vocational technical institution, in a specialized field for the job.

NATURE OF WORK IN THIS CLASS:

This position will serve as the primary documents manager for ARRA funding within the Plant and Facilities unit. The magnitude of projects and timelines associated with the ARRA funding requires a dedicated person to manage the \$17M+ reporting and oversight requirements. This is moderately complex technical work involved in planning, developing, implementing or coordinating federally funded or local programs and projects. Employees in this class perform moderately complex technical duties independently on an on-going basis and participates in the full range of complex technical duties under closer supervision.

MINIMUM KNOWLEDGE ABILITIES AND SKILLS:

Knowledge of the principles and practices of modern public administration. Ability to interpret and apply pertinent programs policies, rules and regulations. Ability to apply bookkeeping principles and compilation of statistics. Ability to plan, develop, implement and coordinate federally funded or local projects and programs. Illustrative Examples of Work: (Any one position may not include all the duties listed nor do the examples cover all the duties which may be performed.) Participates, studies and assists in the planning, development, implementation and coordination of Federal Grants and Aids or local programs and projects applicable to Guam; prepares digest of basic provisions and matching financial requirements, and checks federal registers pamphlets, manuals, report, regional conferences, congressional bills, hearings etc., relating to grants and aids. Participates in the development and implementation of comprehensive plans and annual work programs; assists in analyzing and appraising program performance toward obtaining objectives; provides assistance in the technical development of programs, and reviews the proposed projects for completeness in detail, content, methodology, justification and eligibility. Participates in the preparation of the fiscal year program budget requirements under federal and local programs. Maintains liaison with federal, territorial, and private agencies to insure maximum benefit to programs involved. Ensure that each assigned project has a functional evaluation design; evaluates completed project for cost effectiveness. Collects and analyzes statistical data, prepares program studies and performs research. Performs related duties as assigned.

Education:

Applicants claiming degrees or credit hours are required to provide a copy of their transcripts, high school diploma or GED certification.

Veterans/ Disability Preference:

Applicants claiming veteran's preference points are required to provide a copy of the DD-214 (Military Discharge form). Those claiming Compensable Disability are required to provide a copy of a letter from the Veterans Administration. Applicants claiming disability preference should submit a Government of Guam Certification, Certified by the Director of Public Health and Social Services.

Work Eligibility:

Submission of completed job applications authorizes the University of Guam to seek and obtain regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (e.g. previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records). All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job related sources from legal liability for the information provided.

Should an applicant be convicted of any crimes other than a minor traffic violation, all applicable information must be provided in the form of a police clearance report and court clearance report. Failure to admit any felony convictions may result in immediate disqualification or disciplinary action.

Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter. A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.

Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position within the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with the law.

If applicable, the applicant is subject to **E-Verify** Rules.

Police and Court Clearance:

If selected for the position, you must submit a recent police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearance of no more than three (3) months old from the notification of selection as a condition of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their last place of residence. The cost of the clearance is the applicant's responsibility.
